

Shared Care between PHC and Tertiary sites

GPO Model

What is the Midwifery-Led Model?

Continuity of care by a known midwife or small team

Focus on low-risk pregnancies

Empowerment and informed decision-making for women

Emphasis on holistic, womancentered care









Referral Pathway



Referral process: On the PHC website it directs GP's to complete a form and send it through to PHC.Referrals@health.wa.gov.au



If sent through the Central referral process, then it will be faxed to us.



Patients can bring in their referral from the GP to make the booking appointment









What General Practitioners can do to support women

Engage early in shared care planning

Know local referral pathways

Early screening and booking bloods as per the Schedule

Refer women at 16 weeks' gestation to PHC so a timely Booking appointment can be made at around 19/20 weeks

Encourage women to ask about midwifery-led care









Summary

- Midwifery-led models are effective for low-risk pregnancies.
- General Practitioners play a critical role in early screening, referrals, and escalation.
